Since joining the University of Tennessee Medical Center, Dr. Boukovalas has led development of their Comprehensive Lymphedema Service and is co-chair of the TN Chapter of the Lymphatic Education & Research Network.

His clinical interests include oncologic and trauma reconstruction, microsurgery, lymphedema surgery, and general plastic and cosmetic surgery. His passions involve innovative and cutting-edge surgical techniques, including DIEP and PAP flaps for breast reconstruction, neurotized free flaps, head and neck reconstruction using virtual surgical planning (VSP), lymph node transplantation and lympho-venous bypass surgery using super-microsurgery techniques.

On the academic side, Dr. Boukovalas has a strong interest in research, surgical education, and contributing to scientific societies. He is affiliated with the American Society of Plastic Surgeons and the American Society of Reconstructive Microsurgery. He has served on several national scientific committees and as a member of task forces contributing to guideline development and patient care quality improvement. His research is focused on clinical outcomes, healthcare disparities, and guideline development.

Dr. Boukovalas has published more than 40 peer-reviewed articles along with five individual book chapters. He has presented research at numerous regional, national, and international conferences, and has earned prestigious research and teaching awards, including the Resident Alpha Omega Alpha, Outstanding Plastic Surgery Resident, and the ASRM Outstanding Paper Awards.

Dr. Boukovalas was born and raised in Athens, Greece. He earned his medical degree at the University of Athens School of Medicine. After completing his Plastic Surgery Residency at the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston, he moved onto a fellowship in Microsurgery and Complex Reconstruction at the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center.

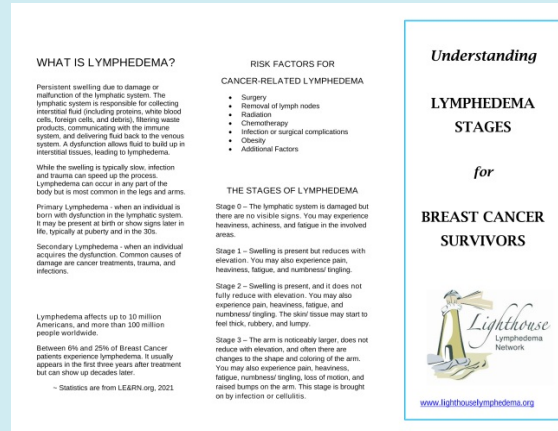
**Lymphedema Treatment Act

Georgia Alliance for Breast
Cancer**

On Tuesday, June 4, LLN board member Debbie Labarthe talked about the history of the Lymphedema Treatment Act with attendees of a Survivor's Breakfast hosted by the Georgia Alliance for Breast Cancer.

Debbie shared the story of her grandson,

Carson, who was diagnosed with congenital lymphedema as a baby. With treatment and support, Carson grew up to play baseball and advocate in Washington DC for the Lymphedema Treatment Act. Debbie also shared Heather Ferguson's inspiring story of advocating for patients for more than ten years. Passage of the Lymphedema Treatment Act in 2022 will help compression and other lymphedema care be covered by insurance for all patients.
